

Research PhD studentships - Clinical Research Training Fellowships in Methodology

4 projects have been identified as suitable for a clinician, and would offer a clinical salary, commensurate with experience. The CRTF supports clinically active professionals within the UK to undertake a higher research degree. These projects would provide three- years support.

Eligibility- clinical requirements

- Clinically qualified applicants are expected to be undertaking their specialty training and have completed their Membership of the Royal College of Physicians (MRCP) (or equivalent) exams.
- Applicants should be at an appropriate point in their clinical training to step out of programme and undertake a PhD, and are usually ST3/4 level depending on their chosen specialty.
- Applicants should have clear plans for the completion of their specialty training and have consulted their deanery about the planned period out of programme prior to submitting an application.
- Veterinarians may apply where they have equivalent qualifications to those above and providing their project is of relevance to human health.
- Nurses, midwives and members of the allied health professions must have completed their professional training and hold a research Master's degree, or equivalent postgraduate research-oriented qualification.
